
Common Feline Oral Diseases

While less frequent dental patients than dogs, cats may be afflicted with a variety of diseases of the oral cavity. Tooth resorption, periodontitis, and fractured canine teeth are commonly diagnosed in cats. Chronic gingivostomatitis is less common but a very important disease, as it may lead to euthanasia in severe, refractory cases. This presentation will discuss each of these diseases, including typical findings on intraoral radiographs & diagnostic dental charting, treatment options, and prognosis.
